Consultant in Colorectal and Laparoscopic Surgeon

King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

- Mr Amyn Haji was appointed as a Consultant in Colorectal and Laparoscopic Surgery at King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust in 2011 and is currently the Clinical Lead for Endoscopy and Colorectal Surgery.
- His clinical practice primarily consists of laparoscopic colorectal surgery, advanced colonoscopy and laparoscopic hernia surgery. Mr Haji graduated from the University of Cambridge in 1999 where he was awarded a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery degree and a Master of Arts. Mr Haji was admitted as a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England in February 2010 and received his certificate of completion of training (CCT) in March 2011.
- His research and clinical interests are in utilization of high frequency colonoscopy ultrasound in the staging of colorectal polyps and cancer. He completed a fellowship in advanced colonoscopy with Professor Kudo at Showa University in Japan in 2010 and since then has developed a practice of endoscopic mucosal resection and endoscopic submucosal dissection in the treatment of colorectal polyps and advanced endoscopy techniques. He also introduced Peroral endoscopic myotomy for Achalasia to the United Kingdom I 2013 and is the leading expert in this field in the UK.

Dr Hayee is a Consultant Gastroenterologist at King's College Hospital and has been Clinical Lead for the department since 2015. He trained at Guy's Hospital (GKT Medical School), graduating in 1999, and was appointed a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians in 2015. His PhD, awarded in 2010, examined the role of innate immunity and neutrophil function in Crohn's disease.

He is a Reader in Gastroenterology at King's College London and maintains an active research interest, supervising several PhD fellows and basic scientists.

He is nationally-accredited for bowel cancer screening colonoscopy and has specialist interests in Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) and high-quality endoscopy. He is training lead for Endoscopy at King's and led development of the specialist IBD service from 2012-2017, being shortlisted for an HSJ Excellence in Healthcare award in 2017. In 2011, he was awarded a travelling fellowship to Yokohama, Japan to study advanced endoscopic techniques with Professors Haruhiro Inoue and Shin-ei Kudo and is co-director of the King's Institute of Therapeutic Endoscopy.

Dr. Neumann acts as Associate Editor for Digestive Endoscopy and Digestive and Liver Disease and as Editorial Board Member of Endoscopy, United European Journal and The Video Journal and Encyclopedia of GI Endoscopy. He has also been assigned as a member of the ASGE International Committee and a Fellow of the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (FASGE).

His contribution to the field of endoscopy is officially recognized by the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (ASGE) and the European Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (ESGE).

Dr. Neumann has published over 160 articles in the field of advanced endoscopic imaging and on new and emerging endoscopic devices. His scientific research was published in high-rated journals, including Nature, Lancet Oncology, Nature Medicine, Gastroenterology, Gastrointestinal Endoscopy and Endoscopy. Besides, he holds multiple patents on advanced endoscopic imaging techniques.

She completed her Internal Medicine residency at New York Presbyterian Hospital-Weill Cornell Campus and her fellowship in Gastroenterology at New York Presbyterian Hospital-Columbia Campus, where she also received a masters in patient oriented research. She also completed her Advanced Endoscopy Fellowship at Johns Hopkins University Hospital.

She has a special interest in the endoscopic treatment of obesity and the diseases of the pancreas and biliary tract, including pancreatitis, fluid collection, sphincter of oddi dysfunction and pancreatic cancer. She is grant funded for trials with malignant biliary obstruction. She sees patients for advanced endoscopic procedures, staging of GI cancers, and treatment or removal of early cancer lesions, surveillance and ablation of pancreatic cysts, and for obesity treatment.

- Prof. Raf Bisschops obtained his Medical Degree in 1997, a Ph.D. degree, and certification in gastroenterology in 2005 at the University of Leuven. He is head of the clinic and associate professor at the Catholic University of Leuven (KU Leuven), faculty of medicine. He is director of endoscopy since 2013 in service with over 25.000 endoscopic procedures per year.
- His main interest is advanced endoscopic imaging and therapeutics for premalignant conditions (Barrett, HNPCC, colitis), artificial intelligence, and quality in endoscopy. He was co-editor of the journal Endoscopy between 2011 and 2020. He was the president of the Belgian Society of Gastrointestinal endoscopy between 2018-2021. Within the European Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy, he is currently the Secretary-General, and served as chairman of the ESGE quality committee and chairman of the ESGE curriculum working group.

Dr. Haidry is a consultant gastroenterologist and interventional endoscopist at University College Hospital, London. He trained at St Mary's Hospital in London and completed his specialist gastroenterology training in North East London. He was then appointed to a two-year academic fellowship at UCL where he examined state of the art and innovative diagnostic and therapeutic endoscopic techniques for the diagnosis and treatment of early cancers arising in the gastrointestinal tract.

He was appointed as a consultant in 2011. He was until recently the director of endoscopy for the division of gastroenterology at University College Hospital and leads the upper GI interventional endoscopic unit. His main interests are therapeutic and innovative endoscopic procedures. In particular he has focused his interest in pre-malignant and malignant disorders of the upper gastrointestinal tract, with a particular interest in Barrett's neoplasia, Squamous neoplasia, oesophageal cancer and metabolic and bariatric endoscopic procedures such as Duodenal mucosal resurfacing (DMR) and Endoscopic Sleeve Gastroplasty (ESG).

He has an academic position of associate professor at UCL where he supervises his team to generate research into the endoscopic techniques and procedures he carries out to improve and streamline the care we give to our patients. His research is focused on existing and novel endoscopic imaging technologies for detecting early cancers such as artificial intelligence. His other main research focus is minimally invasive techniques for treating cancers of the upper gastrointestinal tract and continues to lead and be involved actively on several national and international clinical trials in these fields.

- Dr. Tsiamoulos has authored and co-authored several national and international publications and has also worked as a reviewer for reputed professional journals. He has an active association with different societies and academies from all around the world and has received several awards for his contributions to the scientific community.
- For 5 years (2012 2017) he held the esteemed post of the Clinical Endoscopy/Research Fellow and Senior Gastroenterologists/Endoscopist working in tandem with Professor Brian P. Saunders, at Wolfson Unit for Endoscopy at St Mark's Hospital and Academic Institute.
- He is the co-creator of Endocuff Vision™, a unique scope design that represents the improvement of polyp colonoscopy quality and efficiency. Clinical use of Endocuff Vision™ has a proven higher detection rate of precancerous polyps and within the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program registered a 10% increase in tumour detection rate.
- His basic PhD thesis (in molecular mimicry in IBD) and clinical MD (Res) ongoing research in Luminal at Imperial College, London led to his appointment as a Consultant in Gastroenterology/Specialist in Gastrointestinal Endoscopy at East Kent University Hospital Foundation NHS Trust. He has held this position with EKUHFT since 2015.
- As a leader in field he regularly performs talks, gives presentations and delivers training all around the world as well as sharing his expertise with the BBC and other media organisations. Since 2012, he has already given five invited international lectures in Hellenic Congress of Gastroenterology and several oral presentations/posters to British National and international congresses (moderator, speaker, organizing committee).

Dr Devinder Bansi qualified from Southampton University Medical School in 1988. He completed several junior medical posts and knew very early on that he wanted to work in gastroenterology.

In 1993, Dr Bansi was appointed Research Fellow in Gastroenterology at Oxford's prestigious and internationally acclaimed John Radcliffe Hospital. He completed his MD thesis in the field and also had several peer-reviewed research papers published in acclaimed journals.

In 1996, Dr Bansi returned to London as Senior Specialist Registrar and undertook further advanced training in therapeutic gastroscopy, colonoscopy, ERCP and oesophageal physiology.

Upon completion of gastroenterology and general medical training, Dr Bansi was appointed Consultant Gastroenterologist and Honorary Senior Lecturer in Medicine to the prestigious Hammersmith Hospital NHS Trust and the Royal Postgraduate Medical School (now part of Imperial College.)

Dr Bansi is now one of the senior and leading interventional endoscopists at the trust He is also one of London's foremost experts in bariatric endoscopy procedures for weight loss and works with the leading London Weight Centre.
