Mr Amyn Haji

Consultant in Colorectal and Laparoscopic Surgeon

King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust Mr Amyn Haji was appointed as a Consultant in Colorectal and Laparoscopic Surgery at King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust in 2011 and is currently the Clinical Lead for Endoscopy and Colorectal Surgery.

His clinical practice primarily consists of laparoscopic colorectal surgery, advanced colonoscopy and laparoscopic hernia surgery. Mr Haji graduated from the University of Cambridge in 1999 where he was awarded a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery degree and a Master of Arts. Mr Haji was admitted as a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England in February 2010 and received his certificate of completion of training (CCT) in March 2011.

His research and clinical interests are in utilization of high frequency colonoscopy ultrasound in the staging of colorectal polyps and cancer. He completed a fellowship in advanced colonoscopy with Professor Kudo at Showa University in Japan in 2010 and since then has developed a practice of endoscopic mucosal resection and endoscopic submucosal dissection in the treatment of colorectal polyps and advanced endoscopy techniques. He also introduced Peroral endoscopic myotomy for Achalasia to the United Kingdom I 2013 and is the leading expert in this field in the UK.

Dr Hayee is a Consultant Gastroenterologist at King's College Hospital and has been Clinical Lead for the department since 2015. He trained at Guy's Hospital (GKT Medical School), graduating in 1999, and was appointed a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians in 2015. His PhD, awarded in 2010, examined the role of innate immunity and neutrophil function in Crohn's disease.

He is a Reader in Gastroenterology at King's College London and maintains an active research interest, supervising several PhD fellows and basic scientists.

He is nationally-accredited for bowel cancer screening colonoscopy and has specialist interests in Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) and high-quality endoscopy. He is training lead for Endoscopy at King's and led development of the specialist IBD service from 2012-2017, being shortlisted for an HSJ Excellence in Healthcare award in 2017. In 2011, he was awarded a travelling fellowship to Yokohama, Japan to study advanced endoscopic techniques with Professors Haruhiro Inoue and Shin-ei Kudo and is co-director of the King's Institute of Therapeutic Endoscopy.

He further honed his skills in endoscopy and ERCP, training at the reputable University College London Hospitals.

An active researcher in the hepatology field, he has published extensively in peer-reviewed papers, contributed to book chapters, and co-authored Hepatology at a Glance. His main clinical interests include biliary disease, as well as treatment and management of all kinds of conditions to do with the liver or pancreas. At present, he works as consultant hepatologist at the Guthrie Clinic, and consultant hepatologist at the Institute of Liver Studies, King's College Hospital.

He was then appointed to a two-year academic fellowship at UCL where he examined state of the art and innovative diagnostic and therapeutic endoscopic techniques for the diagnosis and treatment of early cancers arising in the gastrointestinal tract.

He was appointed as a consultant in 2011. He was until recently the director of endoscopy for the division of gastroenterology at University College Hospital and leads the upper GI interventional endoscopic unit. His main interests are therapeutic and innovative endoscopic procedures. In particular he has focused his interest in pre-malignant and malignant disorders of the upper gastrointestinal tract, with a particular interest in Barrett's neoplasia, Squamous neoplasia, oesophageal cancer and metabolic and bariatric endoscopic procedures such as Duodenal mucosal resurfacing (DMR) and Endoscopic Sleeve Gastroplasty (ESG).

He has an academic position of associate professor at UCL where he supervises his team to generate research into the endoscopic techniques and procedures he carries out to improve and streamline the care we give to our patients. His research is focused on existing and novel endoscopic imaging technologies for detecting early cancers such as artificial intelligence. His other main research focus is minimally invasive techniques for treating cancers of the upper gastrointestinal tract and continues to lead and be involved actively on several national and international clinical trials in these fields.

He is Vice President of Endoscopy at the British Society of Gastroenterology (BSG), on the Council of the European Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (ESGE) and is director of the annual London Live Endoscopy course.

He has written several original papers, review articles and contributed to national guideline development in the field of GI endoscopy

A recognised national expert in luminal gastroenterology, he receives referrals of complex patients with inflammatory bowel disease, irritable bowel syndrome ,celiac disease, anaemia and capsule endoscopy. Dr Morris has held several senior positions in UK and European Gastroenterology including Scottish and British Society of Gastroenterology (BSG) and Joint Accreditation Group endoscopy (JAG) council member, endoscopy committee secretary of the BSG and board member of the European Society for GI Endoscopy.

Dr. Tsiamoulos has authored and co-authored several national and international publications and has also worked as a reviewer for reputed professional journals. He has an active association with different societies and academies from all around the world and has received several awards for his contributions to the scientific community.

For 5 years (2012 - 2017) he held the esteemed post of the Clinical Endoscopy/Research Fellow and Senior Gastroenterologists/Endoscopist working in tandem with Professor Brian P. Saunders, at Wolfson Unit for Endoscopy at St Mark's Hospital and Academic Institute.

He is the co-creator of Endocuff Vision[™], a unique scope design that represents the improvement of polyp colonoscopy quality and efficiency. Clinical use of Endocuff Vision[™] has a proven higher detection rate of precancerous polyps and within the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program registered a 10% increase in tumour detection rate.

His basic PhD thesis (in molecular mimicry in IBD) and clinical MD (Res) ongoing research in Luminal at Imperial College, London led to his appointment as a Consultant in Gastroenterology/Specialist in Gastrointestinal Endoscopy at East Kent University Hospital Foundation NHS Trust. He has held this position with EKUHFT since 2015.

As a leader in field he regularly performs talks, gives presentations and delivers training all around the world as well as sharing his expertise with the BBC and other media organisations. Since 2012, he has already given five invited international lectures in Hellenic Congress of Gastroenterology and several oral presentations/posters to British National and international congresses (moderator, speaker, organizing committee).

In 1996, Dr Bansi returned to London as Senior Specialist Registrar and undertook further advanced training in therapeutic gastroscopy, colonoscopy, ERCP and oesophageal physiology.

Upon completion of gastroenterology and general medical training, Dr Bansi was appointed Consultant Gastroenterologist and Honorary Senior Lecturer in Medicine to the prestigious Hammersmith Hospital NHS Trust and the Royal Postgraduate Medical School (now part of Imperial College.)

He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of London. He is a member of the BSG and ESGE. His main interests include advanced endoscopy procedures such as endoscopy imaging techniques, (i-Scan, chromoendoscopy) EMR, EPMR, full thickness resection, under water colonoscopy and polypectomy.

He was the first gastroenterologist to introduce endoscopic treatment of Zenker in United Kingdom and has published widely on this procedure and co-led ESGE guideline on Zenker Diverticulum.

With 2 other units he introduced endoscopic full thickness resection in the UK. He was co-author and proof editor to the reference Atlas of Digestive Endoscopic Resection, a project of Fudan University. He was awarded visiting professor of Research Institute of Fudan University in September 2015.

He is an advisor for NICE interventional procedures in endoscopy and has acted as part of the National clinical advisors to NCEPOD: GI bleed study. He has published widely in peer reviewed journal and book chapters. He led the global expert group on underwater colonoscopy and polypectomy DELPHI consensus.

Dr Edward Despott

Consultant Gastroenterologist

Royal Free London

Dr Despott is a consultant gastroenterologist and advanced gastrointestinal (GI) endoscopist whose specialist interests include device assisted enteroscopy (double-balloon enteroscopy (DBE) in particular), capsule endoscopy (CE), therapeutic colonoscopy (particularly complex polypectomy including large endoscopic mucosal resection (EMR) and endoscopic submucosal dissection ESD)) and transnasal upper GI endoscopy.

He is also interested in the diagnosis and management of inflammatory bowel disease and related complications (such as endoscopic management of small bowel and colonic strictures).

Since his appointment in 2012, Dr Despott instigated significant advances at the Royal Free Unit for Endoscopy by making it one of the only 2 centres in London (and one of a handful in the UK) to offer a comprehensive small bowel endoscopy service including DBE and the development of a tertiary advanced polypectomy service.

Erasmus MC, Rotterdam, Netherlands Dr. Arjun Koch is interventional endoscopist at the department of Gastroenterology & Hepatology of the Erasmus University Medical Center in Rotterdam.



His main focus is on endoscopic treatment of early gastrointestinal cancers.

His research focus is on screening, early detection and treatment of early gastrointestinal cancers and training in advanced endoscopic resection techniques.



Prof Shin-ei Kudo

Specially Appointed Professor and Chairman

Showa University Northern Yokohama Hospital Dr Shin-ei Kudo, chairman of the Digestive Disease Center, Showa University Northern Yokohama Hospital, and chairman on the Showa University International Training Center for Endoscopy and Endoscopic Surgery (SUITE), is famous across the world for early diagnosis and treatment of colorectal cancer with endoscopy.

He received his MD and PhD degrees from Niigata University. After receiving academic and clinical training, he began practicing in endoscopy and discovered depressed type 0-IIc colorectal carcinoma. He also was the first to propose the concept of laterally spreading tumors. Dr Kudo also developed Kudo's pit pattern classification, which is used around the world today

Currently, Dr Kudo's main research topics are endocytoscopy and artificial intelligence–assisted endoscopy. He is conducting government-funded research on these topics. To date, he has contributed greatly to the development of endoscopy devices and techniques, having performed over 300,000 cases.



Prof Pradeep Bhandari

Consultant Gastroenterologist Portsmouth Prof Bhandari is a Gastroenterologist with expertise in advanced endoscopic procedures, screening and treatment of gastrointestinal cancers with a special interest in diseases of the stomach and intestines.

In 2004, he received a visiting fellowship to work at one of the world's leading endoscopy units at the National Cancer Centre in Tokyo, Japan and worked with pioneers of new endoscopic techniques involved in diagnosis and endoscopic treatment of cancers.

In 2013, he received two prestigious awards; the Hopkins Endoscopy Award for technical innovation in the field of endoscopy, by the British Society of Gastroenterology and the Crystal Award for research in early cancer diagnosis by the American Gastroenterology Association.
